Help Build Shalom

The 2007 Delegation to Chile consisted of myself (Jonathan Rumburg), Brittany Striklen, Clint Messner, of First Christian Church, and Kendra Matvey from High Street Christian Church. Together we traveled to the cities of Santiago, Talca, San Clemente, points in be-

tween, and of course we traveled to the Shalom Center. We were greeted and welcomed by Chilean friends, brothers and sisters in Christ, and embraced as if we were long lost family. Truthfully, it's hard to explain this trip to people. I can say that it's a mission trip, like going to church camp, or that it's a work trip, but really it's more. This trip to Chile is about building Shalom for the people of God. That is why as coordinator I entitled this trip "Help Build Shalom." We would be physically working on, improving, and building up the Shalom Center, but we would also be building relationships between the Christian Church in Ohio and the Pentecostal Church of Chile. We would be building up the body of the church universal between brothers and sisters of Christ who don't even speak the same language. They would need to be prepared to be uncomfortable because what they were about to do was going to stretch them in ways that they had never been stretched before. Ways that would be trying and difficult at times, but ways that would reveal to them things about themselves and about their faith they had not yet discovered or experienced within them. They needed to be prepared to be uncomfortable in the physical sense, but also in a spiritual sense as well. For instance, Clint would need to be prepared to be uncomfortable in the physical sense because he would be the largest man in the entire country, a country that is built and designed for people half his size. Add to that the work to be done would be physically taxing and often times tedious. Just ask Brittany about the hours spent trying to trim back the Andean forest seeking to overgrown the already barely accessible road to the Shalom Center, or see what Kendra has to say about her hours painting an oil base sealant onto the Welcome House at the Shalom Center. Not to mention we would be walking and hiking up some very large mountains. Then there was the need to be prepared to be uncomfortable spiritually. The Pentecostal Church of Chile is much louder and much more exuberant in their style of worship than any church any of us had ever been in. The dozens of instruments and loud interactive singing would be dramatically different from our style of worship. If they were prepared to be uncomfortable, then when such instances of uncomfortable-ness did happen, the opportunity for God's revelation through such a unique opportunity would not be missed. Having made this trip twice before, I was well aware of what it could do to and for a person. So I asked them to seek out and answer one simple question, "Why are you here?" Any of us could have answered that question very easily. "I wanted to

Spiritual Insights Rev. Dr. William H. Edwards

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." – John 15:12 In my personal devotional time this Lenten season, this scripture has been very meaningful. I believe these words contain the heart of the Christian faith, when Jesus tells his disciples to "love one another as I have loved you". Love is the deepest possible expres-

sion of the personality of God. In other words, God is Love and God seeks to be in a love relationship with us. God longs and desires the devotion of our hearts. Even from the beginning of time. When God even reached into divine imagination and create a place in Africa called Eden, where God placed God's creation because God loved us. The Bible is a love story, a story of God reaching out to save humanity. From Genesis to Revelation, the redemption story of the Bible is about God trying to establish an intimate and true relationship with humanity motivated by love. Our faith calls us to "love one another as God and Christ has loved us". For it is only through human relationships that we discover the living Christ fully. And only when we enter into life with Jesus Christ can we genuinely seek to care and love each other fully. When we commit ourselves to others in love, we begin to understand the love of God. When we grasp the love of God, our response is to offer our lives to God. When we give our lives to God, we live for others, placing their needs and concerns above our own. One must move out of one's self to love God completely. One must move from self-centeredness to God-centered. It is a dying to self so that the living God may take residence within us. We need to respond to God's gift of love by loving others. Even to the point where "you love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you." It is only when we receive the word of forgiveness that comes with God's love, that we can look at people that we know that have dug ditches for us, and talked about us and have back-stabbed us and hurt us deeply and we thought we would never get over it. But as we receive that word that informs us that as God has forgiven us and loved us, we have to forgive and love others. It is then that we can look at people who have done us wrong, and say I love you anyhow. "And there is nothing you can do about it". Love has the power to transform every type of human relationship. As Paul told the church at Corinth: - "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It (love) bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. - 1 Cor 13:3-13 We need start living a life style of love. The love we pay to others represents the love we owe to God, the respect we pay to others is a genuine respect for the holiness of God present in His people. We serve a God who loves. God so loved the world that God gave. God caused a portion of God's self to become flesh, and heaven announced that his name should be called Jesus. Yes, God shared- God so loved, and so shared, that whosoever believes, even now, in God's way of sharing and loving, shall discover a quality of life that shall not perish.

One of our objectives is to act as a covenant network of congregations. To ensure we continue to build that relationship, communication is essential. In this issue of the Disciple I thought I would share five (5) Did You Know facts. Did You Know the region participates in a partnership that effectively reduces the premiums we pay by as much as 70% to the Bureau of Workers Compensation? More importantly, did you know that each of our congregations can join in that partnership and reduce their costs by that much or possibly more?

Did you know that we increased attendance at our youth camps in 2006 by 9% over 2005? That equates to 84 more youth attending Camp Christian and Partnership camps than the previous year. We predict even further growth in 2007.

Did You Know that we have identified four (4) different capital purchases required for camp that we are hoping will be funded by donations from individuals and congregations? It's part of our program to fund capital expenses. These include a new truck, a tractor, boats and canoes for the lake, and a new sign for the entrance.

Did You Know that the first annual Youth Scholarship Event raised over \$4,000 in 2006 and that we are planning to double that amount in 2007? By the way, the Event is planned for June 2. You can participate in both the golf and dinner programs or join us for dinner only.

Did You Know that we have upgraded our Web site and that you can now register for Events online and use your credit cards for payments? We hope this makes the registration process simpler and more convenient for you. This is a secure and confidential process and was designed to protect its users. There has been a significant increase in the number of registrations using this service in the past 6 months.

In the next Disciple I plan to write about Camp Christian and the four strategies we are following to improve the financial results of this wonderful ministry. I would appreciate hearing from you, especially if you have topics you would like for me to write about.

FCC Alliance Mission Trip

On January 13 First Christian Church of Alliance sent eight members and friends on a Mission Trip to Port Arthur, Texas, where they helped repair homes damaged by Hurricane Rita, which hit ten days after Hurricane Katrina. The trip was planned and led by Jill Smith, Director of Family Ministry. The group worked with the Southeast Texas Interfaith Organization (SETIO), which is in the process of repairing 800 homes. The trip was financed by a grant from Week of Compassion offerings, the workers' and individuals' donations, and church fund raisers. The group traveled from Alliance for two days to Port Arthur, where they slept on the gym floor of the Port Arthur First Christian Church. The church provided their breakfast and a packed lunch each day. Their four days of work included installing insulation, laying an attic floor, and dry wall installation in two different homes. Those participating on the project were Jeannette and Ron Carlile, Larry Koenigseker, Joan Roberts, Mort DeHoff, Norma Dickerhoof, Donna Los, and Smith. According to Smith, "You just really feel like you've done something to make a difference. The people that you meet are just so appreciative." Smith planned the trip with the help of the Disciples' Division of Homeland Ministries and a grant from the Ohio Disciples Outreach Ministry Team.

experience a different culture.” “I had the time and thought it would be fun.” “I wanted to travel.” While those are true, and fine answers, I challenged them to go deeper, and search out why God wanted them to be there, reminding them

that such an answer may not come while we were in Chile, but perhaps would come weeks, or months, or even years later. They pushed themselves to new levels within themselves; their faith; and their spirituality, all in an effort to discover why God had led them there. We were given a great opportunity, to travel to a distant country, to immerse ourselves in an entirely different culture, to build Shalom for the people of God in a variety of ways, to experience the grace and peace of God in unexpected and unimaginable ways. Elena Huegel, the Disciples Overseas missionary who serves in Chile, and who was our director, highlighted and emphasized to us these great opportunities that were afforded, and then she said something that I will never forget. Elena said, “With great opportunity comes great responsibility.” The Christian Church in Ohio, through its outreach giving of the Keep the Fire Burning Campaign, has helped build Shalom. Through abundant generosity, the Christian Church in Ohio recognized its opportunity to be responsible with the resources it was afforded, and we responded to that responsibility. We must remember that the abundant and generous opportunities we are afforded continue to be given to us each and everyday. We have the opportunity to live comfortably in warm homes filled with abundant food, to go to school and earn whatever degree we want, to work at jobs we love, to have excellent and effective health care, to spend money on frivolous things that might cost as little as one dollar to as much as thousands of dollars. We have opportunities that the majority of the world does not. I say that not to make anyone feel guilty about having such opportunities. Not at all. But I do say it to make us a little uncomfortable. What we need to understand is that we are blessed abundantly with great opportunities, and with those, comes great responsibility. With that understanding, with that uncomfortable-ness, I implore us all to answer the same question asked of 2007 Ohio Delegation to Chile. Why are you here? Why are you here in this place? Why are you a part of this body? Why are you in the church? Why are you here? Answer that question, within the uncomfortable realization of our abundant blessings, and you too, without even needing to have gone to Chile, will begin to discover things about yourself, your faith, and your spirit, that you have not yet discovered. Things that God wants and needs all of us to discover so that we can continue to build Shalom for the people of God.
